
ABOUT UOSSM

UOSSM GLOBAL IMPACT

Over the years, we have served millions of people in need, offering indiscriminate support to those who need it most. Operating across conflict- and crisis-affected regions, primarily in Syria, Turkey, Jordan, and more recently in Gaza, we champion initiatives and community services that reduce exposure to risks and uphold the right to live with dignity. Our aim is to deliver high-quality, dignified, and cost-effective care to the most vulnerable populations.

EMERGENCY DISASTER RELIEF

We provide vital support to affected families during times of crisis through emergency and medical services, including medical relief, food aid, shelter, hygiene kits, and training of medical personnel to effectively manage emergency conditions. Most recently, we responded to the devastating earthquake in Syria and Turkey, and the humanitarian crisis in Gaza, by providing immediate emergency and medical relief to the victims. Our disaster relief efforts embody our commitment to responding swiftly to emergencies, minimizing human suffering, and restoring dignity to affected individuals



HEALTH CARE & MEDICAL RELIEF

We provide these services through primary healthcare centers, mobile clinics, reproductive health programs, nutrition programs, dental care, referral services, provision of free medications, emergency medical transportation (EMT), hospital support, and the delivery of specialized medical, surgical, physical, and rehabilitation services. These efforts ensure that the most vulnerable populations have access to receive essential and dignified medical assistance.



MENTAL HEALTH AND PROTECTION

We provide community-based and specialized mental health and psychosocial support services to people in need and those affected by crisis. Our programs focus on addressing mental health challenges, preventing, and treating mental disorders, and promoting psychosocial well-being. This includes services for children with special needs, child protection initiatives, and prevention and response to sexual and gender-based violence (GBV) within affected communities. Additionally, we support a comprehensive case management program for Syrian orphans inside Syria.

UOSSM GLOBAL IMPACT CONT'D.



NUTRITION AND FOOD INSECURITY

Unsafe conditions disproportionately affect the health and well-being of women and children. Food insecurity is a major factor in the rise of malnutrition as the economic status continues to decline while prices rise causing limited access to healthy food and nutrition. We support the nutrition needs and prevent malnutrition of one of the most vulnerable population groups – pregnant, lactating women and children. Additionally, we provide food essentials to promote overall well-being and prevent malnutrition of people in need and those affected by the crisis.



COMMUNITY PROGRAMS & EARLY RECOVERY

We recognize the immense suffering caused by loss, trauma, displacement, and lack of access to education endured by children and youth during the Syrian crisis. To address these challenges, we support initiatives that focus on educational needs and personal development. Additionally, we empower women and youth, build the capacity of caregivers, teachers, health workers, and mental health professionals, and contribute to rebuilding healthcare systems and community infrastructure.

Jumaa's Story: Growing, Learning, and Thriving

Jumaa was struggling with comprehension, memory, social interactions, and perception. His parents brought him to our Special Needs Rehabilitation (SNR) Center in Idlib, where he received a comprehensive evaluation and a personalized treatment plan tailored to his unique needs.

Since then, Jumaa made remarkable progress.
Thanks to this individualized approach, his determination, and the dedication of our team,
Jumaa returned to school with the skills, confidence, and joy he needs to thrive alongside his peers.
Jumaa's journey is a powerful reminder of the impact of early intervention, compassionate care, and the incredible potential within every child.



Advanced Medical Care That Provides Hope

Abdalla was brought to our hospital in northern Gaza after suffering severe injuries from a missile strike. The blast left him with devastating trauma: both of his lower limbs were amputated, and he had deep, complex wounds across his lower abdomen. His condition was critical, and the pain he endured was constant and overwhelming.

For two months, conventional wound dressings offered no improvement. Abdalla remained in agony, with little indication that his wounds were healing. Recognizing the urgency of his situation, our medical team made the decision to use the Vacuum-Assisted Closure (VAC), commonly known as the WoundVAC, in hopes of promoting rapid and effective healing. The results were remarkable. The negative pressure therapy accelerated the closure of his wounds and significantly reduced his pain. For the first time since his injury, Abdalla experienced relief — and with it, a renewed sense of hope.

THE UOSSM TEAM IN DAMASCUS

After working in Syria for over 12 years, team UOSSM was finally on the ground in Damascus, Syria! The moment was surreal. UOSSM held a conference on December 28 – "United for Recovery" to begin rebuilding the broken healthcare system in all of Syria.


